



NO DISTINCTION

The theme of the two readings from John is love, and in the opening prayer we pray that we might “express in our lives the love we celebrate.” The Johannine formula, used in both 1 John and the Gospel, is: “Love one another.”

One might interpret this formula in terms of a false understanding of the Hebrew law: Love those who belong to your group and stay away from outsiders. The reading from Acts, however, makes it clear that we are to love everyone without exception, for “God shows no partiality” and we are to pattern our love after God’s love.

The generosity of the Spirit surprised the circumcised believers accompanying Peter. They had grown up believing that God favors some people over others.

They are not unlike the people of our day who look down on others, regarding as inferior all those whom they consider “Gentiles” (= outsiders): African Americans, Mexican Americans, Asian Americans, Native Americans, women, gays, the handicapped, the poor. Such favoritism does not bind the Spirit of God.

The Spirit will rescue the “insiders” from their hidden atheism by revealing God’s love to everyone. Liberation for the “outsiders” will also come from the Spirit, not from any action by the “insiders.”

We cannot in truthfulness call upon that God who is the Father of all if we refuse to act in a brotherly way toward certain men, created though they be to God’s image.

A man’s relationship with God the Father and his relationship with his brother men are so linked together that Scripture says: ‘He who does not love does not know God’ (1 Jn 4:8).

The ground is therefore removed from every theory or practice which leads to a distinction between men or peoples in the matter of human dignity and the rights which flow from it.

As a consequence, the Church rejects, as foreign to the mind of Christ, any discrimination against men or harassment of them because of their race, color, condition of life, or religion.

Vatican II, *Declaration on the Relationship of the Church to Non-Christian Religions*, 1965: 5.

DIACONAL MINISTRY

This weekend in the Archdiocese of Saint Louis, several men were ordained to the “transitional” diaconate (the last step towards priesthood). On June 2, another group of men will be ordained to the “permanent” diaconate. Both celebrations are beautiful examples of how God calls all of us to service, and both remind us of how the ministry of Christ continues to be carried out in those who receive the sacrament of Holy Orders.

The terms “transitional” and “permanent” can be a little misleading. There is only one diaconate. When a man is preparing for priesthood and receives this ministry, it can be a temptation to view it as one more step towards priesthood, rather than celebrating diaconal ordination as a ministry in itself. What’s more, when one takes that view, then there can be a diminished view of those men who are ordained as deacons for life.

So what is diaconal ministry? Its origins are thoroughly biblical. In Acts 6, as the Church grew in numbers, divisions developed over the daily distribution of food to the Hebrew and Greek widows. To deal with this crisis, the apostles gathered together seven men of good repute and ordained them to take charge of the Church’s charitable outreach. From that point on, the office of deacon became one of service and charity. In the early centuries, deacons assisted at the altar and took portions of the Eucharist to those who were sick or homebound. They also proclaimed the Gospel and preached, and assisted at baptisms and marriages. They showed a special concern for the sick and the poor. For hundreds of years, deacons held a prominent role in the faith community and were part of the Church’s ordained ministry.

During the Middle Ages, the role of deacon faded in the Church, and it was reduced to the final step before ordination to the priesthood. (In some cases, men were ordained a deacon one day and a priest the next.) This was an unfortunate development, for it meant that a charism of the Holy Spirit was underutilized. During Vatican II, the bishops called for the restoration of the “permanent” diaconate, and in 1967, Pope Paul VI restored the office of deacon to its rightful position in the Church.

At Sacred Heart, we have been blessed with wonderful deacons, both past and present. To become a permanent deacon takes several years of preparation. Deacons undertake the commitment to serve where they are assigned, to pray the Liturgy of the Hours, and to assist the bishop and priests as much as possible. They normally commit to forty hours per month of service (since their family life always remains the priority). What’s more, deacons make a commitment not to remarry if their wife passes away. (This is in keeping with the ancient tradition that clerics do not enter into marriage, although sometimes the Church has admitted married men to ordination.) In short, men who enter the permanent diaconate are making a generous commitment to serve God and their faith community. We owe them and their families a debt of gratitude for their service.

And I think that is the main reason why the Church has always insisted that men preparing for priesthood first must receive the order of deacon. Anyone called to the priesthood needs to learn generosity, service, and charity, and those terms epitomize the office of deacon. May God bless all of our deacons, permanent and transitional, and may their ministry always bear great fruit in the Church!

NEW PRESCHOOL 3 YEAR OLD SOCCER TRAINING PROGRAM - The Pre-school 3 year old program offers a 1 hour clinic every Sunday afternoon during the season. The season be-

42 of the Biggest Food Companies Make Historic Pledge to Cut Plastic Waste



BANBURY, OXON, UK - 42 of the UK's biggest retailers, supermarkets, manufacturers, and brands have taken a historic pledge to completely transform the plastic packaging sector by 2025.

Corporate giants such as Asda, Nestle, Lidl, Coca-Cola, Aldi, PepsiCo, Unilever, Tesco, Waitrose, Morrisons, Sainsbury, and Pret a Manger have joined the UK Plastics Pledge to eliminate single-use plastic packaging. Together, the signatories represent roughly 80% of the plastics sold in UK supermarkets.

The initiative, which is orchestrated by waste advisory charity WRAP in collaboration with the UK's largest nonprofits, recyclers, and governments, has set a series of goals to cut wasteful packaging over the course of the next seven years.

For starters, the initiative will ensure that 100% of plastic packaging must either be recyclable, compostable, or reusable in order to make it onto supermarket shelves. Some supermarkets have gone even further and declared that plastic packaging will no longer be used on fruits and vegetables.

Environment Secretary Michael Gove, who is backing the pact, said in a statement: "Our ambition to eliminate avoidable plastic waste will only be realized if government, businesses, and the public work together."
