

### **BEING AT PEACE**

The heart of Christian community is the person of Jesus Christ. Jesus is the vine; we are the branches. Living within the vine, we "will produce abundantly." Separated from the vine, we are, "a withered, rejected branch which can do nothing."

The commandment that binds together this community is twofold: to believe in Jesus and to "love one another as he commanded us." When following this commandment of faith and love, "we are at peace before him." Such a community of faith, love and peace is possible, and Luke assures us that "throughout all Judea, Galilee and Samaria the church was at peace."

Our world is not at peace; there is war and division everywhere. For our Church to speak peace to this world, it will have to be a peaceful community. There must be that faith in, and reliance on Jesus, and there must also be that love for one another. The world must be able to look at us and say that we are at peace. Only then will our message of peace get through to others.

That the Church may really be the sign of that solidarity which the family of nations desires, it should show in its own life greater cooperation between the Churches of rich and poor regions through spiritual communion and division of human and material resources.

### POPE FRANCIS AND EMANUELE

y now you may have seen the video that went viral two weeks ago. Pope Francis was having a question and answer session with children in Rome, and a little boy named Emanuele walked up to the microphone. He started to ask his question and then broke down crying and walked away from the microphone, sobbing. Pope Francis asked that he come forward and whisper his question into the Pope's ear. Emanuele did so, and the two had a private conversation. Pope Francis listened intently, nodding, all the while hold the little boy's head close to his own. After the conversation, when Emanuele had returned to his seat, the Pope asked him if he could share what they had talked about, and Emanuele agreed.

As it turns out, Emanuele's father had died recently, and Emanuele was worried that his father had not gone to Heaven because he didn't believe in God. Pope Francis said, "How beautiful to hear a son say that his father was a good man...and how beautiful that he had the courage to cry for his father in front of us, like a true man. Emanuele's father was a good man. He didn't have the faith of a believer, but he still had his children baptized. He had a good heart, and God is the one who decides who goes to Heaven." The Pope then ad-



dressed all the gathered children and said, "God has a father's heart. God has a dad's heart. Does God abandon his children when they are good?" The children all shouted, "No!" and the Pope turned to Emanuele and said, "There, Emanuele, there is the answer. God was surely proud of your father." And he told Emanuele to talk to his father, to pray to him as he would to any loved one in Heaven.

That day Pope Francis demonstrated to the world once again what it means to have the heart of a shepherd. Shepherds love the flock, shepherds will take the time even to comfort a little boy who is crying for his father. And good shepherds—truly good ones, like Pope Francis—allow God's love to so permeate their own hearts to allow themselves to see God's love for all of humanity, His desire to welcome into the Kingdom anyone with a good heart.

So a question some people might ask: Did Pope Francis water down Catholic teaching that day? Did he simply make up an answer in order to comfort a grieving little boy? Not in the slightest. Lumen Gentium, one of the fundamental documents of the Second Vatican Council, states: "Those also can attain to salvation who through no fault of their own do not know the Gospel of Christ or His Church, yet sincerely seek God and moved by grace strive by their deeds to do His will as it is known to them through the dictates of conscience. Nor does Divine Providence deny the helps necessary for salvation to those who, without blame on their part, have not yet arrived at an explicit knowledge of God and with His grace strive to live a good life." (16)

In the case of Emanuele's father, a good man who had his children baptized even he personally struggled with a belief in God, the Pope's answer was based solidly on Catholic teaching. What's more, it is a great comfort to people whose loved ones may have been raised in the Catholic faith but for some reason after searching their hearts simply cannot believe. So often I've done funerals for such people. As I've listened to loved ones describe all of the generous, self-sacrificing acts of the deceased person, it is clear that this was a person who followed the Gospel of Jesus Christ without even realizing it. And the Church teaches us that God makes a place for such people in His Kingdom.

A final question that sometimes arises is, then what is the point of living a Christian life? What is the point of following Catholic teaching, if God is so generous with salvation? The answer is simple. We cannot help but respond to Christ with love and obedience once we have discovered the love He has for us. That's what happens when we fall in love. And once Christ's love has seized our hearts, then, hopefully, we can demonstrate the kind of love Pope Francis showed toward a grieving little boy who was worried that God would reject his deceased father. God is so generous with us. May we always reflect that generosity with one another.

NEW Preschool 3 Year Old Soccer Training Program -

The Preschool 3 year old program offers a 1 hour clinic every Sunday afternoon during the season. The season begins in early September. More Than 70 Volunteers Fix Up Childhood Home So **Homeless Veteran** Can Move Back in



INDIANAPOLIS, IN - Due to the

amount of repairs and renovations that were needed on Michael Malone's childhood home, the 60-year-old veteran has been living in a facility for the homeless.

But thanks to over 70 Indianapolis volunteers, he can finally move back into his rightful home.

Malone, who served in the Air Force from 1976 to 1980 and the Air Reserves from 1981 to 1996, has been trying to recover from the recent deaths of his mother and daughter. Though he was bequeathed his childhood home after his mom's passing, he did not have the money to finance the extensive repairs, which led to his homelessness.

In celebration of National Volunteer Week, dozens of workers from Home Depot and Volunteers of America offered to conduct renovations on Malone's house during their days off.

Within a matter of days, the team remodeled the bathroom, repainted the interior of the house, and installed new flooring. Not only that, but Malone was especially emotional over the American flag that they installed in front of the building.

"This just blows me away that there are people that are really truly that kind. It absolutely restores my view of humanity," said Malone when he saw the results.
